DRAFT MEETING MINUTES

March 22, 2021

Community Center Board Charter:

This board is a citizen's advisory board that provides recommendations to City officials concerning the Community Center and Waterfront Stadium usage and improvements.

The meeting was called to order by Burton Brooks. Roll call was taken and all members were present. S. Katt, present, B. Brooks, present, S. Klaassen, present, J. Porenta, present and Char Seise, staff liaison.

A general call to the audience was given and there were none present.

Approval of the October minutes was made, with a motion by Klaassen, a second by Porenta, all in favor.

Seise reported that the reopening date for the Community Center will be April 5, 2021, operating under the current COVID restrictions of 25 persons. Things are ramping up with seasonal employment and special events.

Seise reported that she has been in communication with regular Community Center users to inform them of the current COVID restrictions and gauge their level of interest in returning to the Community Center.

Seise reported that she would work to find interns from local colleges for marketing of the Community Center.

Seise reported that there is interest from vendors for holding in the indoor craft show. Due to COVID restrictions and not knowing if they will be lifted, it is unlikely that this event will happen in 2021. Katt offered her assistance if the show were to happen.

Board vacancies were discussed, a recommendation to have someone on the board that has interest in the arts was suggested. Seise will make this information known as we plan to reopen and rebuild the Community Center business.

Brooks mentioned getting video cameras at the Community Center and to put them back in the Capital Plan. They were omitted in the 2021 budget cycle.
