1. Call to Order 6:05 p.mWerksma
2. Attendance (all current commissioners present) Absent: Liaison Latsch
3. Approval of Minutes of meeting May 26, 2022 Motion to approve Colson, Supported by Billedeau, all in favor.
4. Welcome Guests Werksma
 - a. None Present. Mayor and City council were invited to attend to hear prepared presentations on the work of the commission. Meeting start time was pushed back to 6:00 p.m. to facilitate their attendance after the farewell reception for City Manager McGinnis. Only one council member, Ryan Cummins, notified us that he would be unable to attend.

7. Liaison Reports (Tri-Cities Puentes Initiative/GH Hispanic Heritage Fiesta) Submitted in writing by Reyna Masko
 - a. After 4 years of asking City Council to allow us to enclose Central Park and close down 4th Street and Columbus (from 5th street to 4th) we were approved with a 5-0 vote at Monday's City Council meeting. WE ARE ECSTATIC! We will be hosting a concert at the Waterfront Stadium on Friday, September 16, 2022 from 5:00 - 9:00 pm. We will be hosting a fundraising dinner with Chef Oscar Moreno on Thursday, September 22 from 5:30-9:00 p.m. at the Community Center. Dinner and drinks will be included with the price of the ticket. More details to follow. The day-long fiesta will be held at Central Park on September 24, 2022 from 11:00 am - 10:30 pm. We will start at Harbor Drive and Washington with a parade of flags and march all the way down Washington to Central Park to set all the flags around the water fountain. The day will be filled with live bands, DJ, children's entertainment, food vendors, beer tent and cultural dances. We are so excited that guests will be able to walk around central park with their children and enjoy food and drinks without having to have the families separated so that one of the parents can enjoy an adult beverage in an enclosed tent. We are needing sponsorships. Last year we fundraised over \$61,000 and so far we are 1/3 of the way there. We are so excited about this new set up and hope we can get the funds needed to make this Fiesta even better than last year! Last year TCPI established 2 programs - We partnered with Ferris State University to bring their Latino centric leadership program to the Lakeshore and we are the parent organization of the Lakeshore Latinas (over 275 members) who provide opportunities to build future Latino leaders. Fiesta proceeds will go directly to support these programs. Each year we also partner with an organization that provides services to the Latin American community. The Fiesta donates half of proceeds (up to \$5,000) and this year we chose Latin Americans United for Progress as the organization to receive these funds. Werksma will also create a foam board presentation with all of the clippings about HRC over the years.

h. Consideration of Sponsorship of the Hispanic Heritage Fiesta..... Werksma

Werksma will speak with Char Seise of Community Affairs to determine the dollar amount of in-kind support from the City so that we can advise Festival organizers and, in view of the city's fiscal situation, believes the HRC will not be successful in any ask to council to provide a \$1,000 cash sponsorship as past councils have voted to do.
